

Please make sure you check your luggage size when packing for the trip. With Jet2 we only have a hand luggage allowance of a 10Kg cabin bag and a backpack that will fit under the seat in front. The airline will be strict on the size and weight of the cabin bag so please ensure this is correct. Cabin bag maximum dimensions are 56 x 45 x 25 cm. This also means that each liquid packed needs to be under 100ml for security. We recommend approximately £100 spending money which can be in cash or a bank card.
