

As we honour St. Hilda, may we follow her example by being kind, encouraging our friends, and using our talents to build a stronger, caring community.



Chloe is a shining example of our school values in action, and we are delighted to celebrate her for going above and beyond. Well done, Chloe - you've made your family and our school community very proud!


Website Launch


Norah's North Pole

Attendance

We apologise that the graph we previously attempted to create using our software did not display correctly and contained inaccurate data. To ensure clarity, we are now presenting the correct figures in a simple table below.

The most recent official DfE data (Autumn 2024 and Spring 2025 combined release) includes absence rates by day of the week. Here are the national figures for state-funded schools in England:

Day	Total Absence	Authorised Absence	Unauthorise d Absence
Mon	7.1%	5.3%	1.8%
Tue	6.8%	5.1%	1.7%
Wed	6.6%	4.9%	1.7%
Thu	6.5%	4.8%	1.7%
Fri	7.4%	5.4%	2.0%

Key points

- Fridays have the highest absence rate overall and the highest unauthorised absence.
- Mondays are also relatively high, suggesting a pattern around weekends.
- Midweek (Tuesday -Thursday) shows lower absence rates.
- Authorised absences make up the majority of absences across all days.

These figures are based on the latest accredited official statistics from the Department for Education for the 2024/25 academic year (Autumn and Spring terms).
