First reading: Proverbs 8:22-31

Before the beginning of the earth, Wisdom was brought forth.

Thus says the Wisdom of God: The Lord possessed me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of old. Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth, before he had made the earth with its fields, or the first of the dust of the world. When he established the heavens, I was there; when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth, then I was beside him, like a master workman, and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always, rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the children of man.

Response: O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name through all the earth!

Second Reading: Romans 5:1-5

To God through Christ in the love which is poured out through the Spirit.

Brothers and Sisters: Since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,
the God who is and who was and who is to come.

Gospel Reading: John 16:12-15

'All that the Father has is mine; the Spirit will take what is mine and declare it to you.'

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples, 'I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine; therefore I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.'

REFLECTION

It is impossible to fully describe the Trinity, to me, it is a mixture of all the power, mystery and wonder of a loving God who knows me as myself and somehow cherishes that knowledge knowing that I am flawed but still a perfect part of His creation. If only we could grasp the reality of that love; we never seem to understand that with all our strengths and weaknesses, despite all our successes and failures, we are truly loved as a perfect human being.

Whenever I read today's passage from the Book of Proverbs my thoughts lead me to the Holy Spirit. The words are ascribed to Solomon, but the message comes from a very ancient culture which saw the work of God in every thought of man. The second line "At first, before the beginning of the earth when there were no depths I was brought forth" reminds me of a line from the first verse of Genesis, "God's Spirit hovered over the waters". When we read this passage, we can see that God's hand is always guiding and caring for he is "delighting in the children of man".

Paul's letter to the Romans reminds us that it is through our faith that we find peace with God. This is not the peace that the world gives; this peace comes through "suffering". Paul sees suffering as a stepping stone to a life of faith. Suffering gives us the strength to endure whatever life throws at us; it builds character and creates in us a feeling of hope for the future. Each of these steps brings us closer to the love of God and so the way to God is "poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us".

In John's Gospel Jesus speaks of the Spirit of Truth; and how "he will lead you to the complete truth. Since the day of Pentecost, the church has been moving towards that truth that Jesus speaks of. The revelation of the truth is a continuing process, and the church continues to gain fresh insights into the depth of God's mercy. A pivotal moment in the church's story was the second Vatican Council. We are the children of the council, and we are called to continue its work. At this time of falling numbers in our clergy and laity we can fail to see the way forward but if we keep our faith in the Holy Spirit then, in time, all will be revealed.

The Blessed Trinity


Today we celebrate the feast day of the Blessed Trinity. The word Trinity is a title for God that tells us that He is three Persons in one God.

Before Jesus came, the people didn't know that God was a Trinity. The Israelites knew that there was only one God, but they didn't know very much about Him. Jesus showed the people that there were three Persons in God when He taught them about Himself and the Father and the Holy Spirit.

The three Persons in the Blessed Trinity are all equal but different. We cannot understand this, but we believe it because Jesus taught it. It is one of the Mysteries of our Faith.

What does the Holy Trinity do for us? We know that God the Father made everything and we are intended to go back to Him. The Holy Spirit guides us towards Him, and Jesus is the way.
