First reading: Acts 2:1-11

‘They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak.’

When the day of Pentecost arrived, the Apostles were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. And they were amazed and astonished, saying, ‘Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians — we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God.’

Response: Send forth your spirit, O Lord, and renew the face of the earth.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13

‘In one Spirit we were all baptised into one body.’

Brothers and Sisters: No one can say ‘Jesus is Lord’ except in the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptised into one body — Jews or Greeks, slaves or free — and all were made to drink of one Spirit.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia.

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful
and kindle in them the fire of your love.

Gospel Reading: John 20:19-23

‘As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you. Receive the Holy Spirit.’

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, ‘Peace be with you.’ When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, ‘Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.’ And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, ‘Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld.’

Pentecost day comes round every year; it is a milestone in our lives. We emerge from Lent and Easter often breathless and aware that once again Christ has paid the ultimate price for our behaviour, and we make the decision to change our ways; make a new resolution to come closer to Him and follow His way. Then the sunshine of summer enters our lives, and we say “Tomorrow Lord” and the summer days pass by until we are once again in autumn and nothing has really changed. How can we change these hearts of ours? How can we make them hearts of flesh and not stone?

Pentecost Sunday is about being changed through an experience. In the first reading the Apostles are changed utterly by their experience of the Holy Spirit; they had listened to the promises of Jesus but could not grasp the reality of His word. Now it is here and happening; they are transformed, they are no longer the frightened crowd of the Good Friday church they are invigorated, encouraged and challenged by their encounter with the Holy Spirit and as they speak to the crowd all who see this transformation are amazed and astonished.

Today’s Psalm speaks of how basic the Holy Spirit is to life itself. In our Creed, we call Him “the Giver of Life”, the psalmist tells us “You send forth your spirit, and they are created, and you renew the face of the earth”. The passage from Romans reminds us that our transformation is a spiritual experience. Paul tells us that, through the Spirit we become “children of God”. We can overcome the flesh, which causes us to sin, by building spiritual lives that inspire us to cry “Abba!, Father!”.

John’s Gospel reminds us of the words of Our Lord – If you love me, you will keep my commandments. This passage speaks of the promise of Jesus to all those who love Him and keep His word. Our Lord assures us that His word will not fail for the Holy Spirit, the helper sent by the Lord, will teach us and help us to remain true to Him. Today is special, both for those who have been faithful all their lives but also for new members of our church who have experienced a real transformation through the blessing of the Easter Vigil. This day was made by the Lord, may we allow the Spirit to enter our lives and transform us.

Pray to the Holy Spirit every day to help you to do everything for God. Then see how your life changes!




Answer to maze puzzle on front: Come Holy Spirit!
