JUBILEE 2025 - Pope Francis has announced that 2025 will be a year of Jubilee, and the theme is "Pilgrims of Hope". It will be a year of pilgrimage and prayer, celebration and reconciliation and we'll be opening the Jubilee Year in our Diocese with celebrations at our 2 Jubilee Hub Churches on Sunday 29th December. Bishop Stephen will be celebrating Mass and opening the Holy Door at St Mary's Cathedral, Newcastle at 11.30am and at St Joseph's Hartlepool at 4.00pm. Everyone is welcome. Further to our meeting in which we discussed the practicalities as a parish of hosting the Holy Door, we have established a team of volunteers for each day who will be able to act as welcomers. The welcomers will open the church, prepare for Mass and simply be a presence in the church whilst it is open. In addition to our own volunteers, Bishop Stephen has requested for priests and laity from around the diocese to support us in welcoming pilgrims. Initially it is thought that the Holy Door will be open every day, Monday to Friday 11am-2.30pm, Saturday 1pm-5pm, and Sunday 9.30am-Noon.

First Reading: Zephaniah 3:14-18a

'The Lord will exult over you with loud singing.'

Sing aloud, O daughter of Sion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter of Jerusalem! The Lord has taken away the judgements against you; he has cleared away your enemies. The King of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst; you shall never again fear evil. On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: 'Fear not, O Sion; let not your hands grow weak. The Lord your God is in your midst, a mighty one who will save; he will rejoice over you with gladness; he will quiet you by his love; he will exult over you with loud singing. I will gather those of you who mourn for the festival, so that you will no longer suffer reproach.'

Response: Shout aloud and sing praise,

for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel.

Second Reading: Philippians 4:4-7

'The Lord is at hand.'

Brothers and sisters: Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia!

The spirit of the Lord has been given to me.

He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor.

Gospel Reading Luke 3:10-18

'And we, what shall we do?'

At that time: The crowds asked John, 'What, then, shall we do?' And he answered them, 'Whoever has two tunics is to share with him who has none, and whoever has food is to do likewise.' Tax collectors also came to be baptised and said to him, 'Teacher, what shall we do?' And he said to them, 'Collect no more than you are authorized to do.' Soldiers also asked him, 'And we, what shall we do?' And he said to them, 'Do not extort money from anyone by threats or by false accusation, and be content with your wages.'

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Christ, John answered them all, saying, 'I baptise you with water, but he who is mightier than I is coming, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.' So with many other exhortations he preached good news to the people.

REFLECTION

Today we celebrate God's gift of Joy. In our broken world, when joy seems to be missing from so many people's lives, how do we begin to celebrate this wonderful aift?

To begin we must consider what we have and build upon those strong foundations. We have the gift of life; it is a precious gift for it gives us the time and the energy to change, change not only our own lives but the lives of those around us. We have the gift of family and friendship; there are people around us who are ready to support and nourish us, helping us to find the true path to happiness. We have the gift of faith; we believe in our God of love who is ever forgiving and always there through the joys and sorrows of life.

Zephaniah lived in a world of great inequality, at a time when the morale of his people was at a very low ebb. Yet his words ring with conviction and joy. He knows that God walks with his people and shares with them in the storms of life. He calls to them "Rejoice and exult with all your heart". He can see a time when everything will be made right because "The King of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst.

Paul speaks to the Philippians, "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I will say rejoice". He urges them to be tolerant of those who have no faith, no hope, no joy. If those who listen seek God with prayer and thanksgiving, then the peace of God will be with them.

John tells us what we must do. Share our gifts, shun complacency, never be content with our lives, strive each day to act justly, show the love of God to all we meet. He assures the people that the Christ is coming and that they must be ready to receive Him into their hearts, This is a season of waiting, the Christ child is near, we must look forward to his coming and build on His promise of a brighter future for all.
