First Reading: Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18

God enters into a covenant with Abram, the man of faith.

In those days: God brought Abram outside and said, 'Look towards heaven, and number the stars, if you are able to number them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your offspring be.' And he believed the Lord, and he counted it to him as right-eousness.

And he said to him, 'I am the Lord who brought you out from Ur of the Chaldeans to give you this land to possess.' But he said, 'O Lord God, how am I to know that I shall possess it?' He said to him, 'Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtle-dove, and a young pigeon.' And he brought him all these, cut them in half, and laid each half over against the other. But he did not cut the birds in half. And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away.

As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell on Abram. And behold, dreadful and great darkness fell upon him. When the sun had gone down and it was dark, behold, a smoking firepot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. On that day the Lord made a covenant with Abram, saying, 'To your offspring I give this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the river Euphrates.'

Response: The Lord is my light and my salvation.

Second Reading: Philippians 3:17-4:1

Christ will configure us to his glorious body.

Brothers and sisters, join in imitating me, and keep your eyes on those who walk according to the example you have in us. For many, of whom I have often told you and now tell you even with tears, walk as enemies of the cross of Christ. Their end is destruction, their god is their belly, and they glory in their shame, with minds set on earthly things. But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself. Therefore, my brothers and sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm thus in the Lord, my beloved.

Gospel Acclamation:

Glory to you, O Christ, Wisdom of God the Father. From a bright cloud, the Father's voice was heard: 'This is my beloved Son, listen to him'. Glory to you, O Christ, Wisdom of God the Father.

Gospel Reading Luke 9:28b-36

'As Jesus was praying, the appearance of his face was altered.'

At that time: Jesus took with him Peter and John and James and went up on the mountain to pray. And as he was praying, the appearance of his face was altered, and his clothing became dazzling white. And behold, two men were talking with him, Moses and Elijah, who appeared in glory and spoke of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and those who were with him were heavy with sleep, but when they became fully awake they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. And as the men were parting from him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is good that we are here. Let us make three tents, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah' — not knowing what he said. As he was saying these things, a cloud came and overshadowed them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. And a voice came out of the cloud, saying, 'This is my Son, my Chosen One; listen to him!' And when the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and told no one in those days anything of what they had seen.

REFLECTION

Lent is a time of hope; in our modern world there are many who live without hope. The world is in crisis, there are countries where war and disease are endemic. How can we find hope in a world where many are hope less?

Today's readings are a reminder to us of where hope can be found. In the first reading we hear the story of Abram, a wandering refugee, far from his native land, scratching out an existence in the deserts of the Middle East. Abram finds a God who he can believe in, a God who gives him hope, who promises him that he will be the father of many nations and that his descendants will be as many as the stars in heaven. Abram's faith brings a covenant of hope between God and his people and from these beginnings a nation is born.

The psalms are the prayers of a people of hope. Today we are reminded that God is our light and our help that if we believe in him then we live without fear of the future for He listens when we call, and we can hold firm and take heart for He is at our side.

Paul's letter to the Philippians was written from prison; not a place where hope is in abundance. Paul's message however is about freedom. He reminds us that true freedom comes from serving the Lord and keeping to His way. Home to Paul is heaven; that is the blessed place where we shall be transfigured into copies of Christ's glorious body. He urges us to not give way to the temptations of the world but stay strong, keep hoping and be faithful to the Lord.

Peter, James and John are symbols of hope to us; they were fishermen plucked from obscurity and given a place, a role in the ministry of Our Lord. They must have wondered at times "What is this life all about?" "Why have we left home and good jobs to wander the land following this man?" The day they spent on Mount Tabor must have sent their hopes soaring in the sky. They witnessed something that no other human person has ever seen. When Jesus was transfigured, before their eyes, they must have hoped that one day they too would be transfigured with Christ and that this would be the hope and destiny of all who followed Him.
