Prayer for Vocations



JUBILEE 2025 - We're all invited into an encounter with Jesus Christ, as his disciples of mercy, forgiveness, and social action, and to celebrate our communities. The Holy Door will be open during this Year of Jubilee, where pilgrims are invited to enter and receive a plenary indulgence. The Jubilee indulgence, thanks to the power of prayer, is intended in a particular way for those who have gone before us, so that they may obtain full mercy.

To gain a plenary indulgence, a person is invited to complete four specific acts: passing through a Holy Door, go to confession, receive the Eucharist, and pray for the intentions of the Pope. It's a way to show your commitment to living a better life and growing closer to God.

HOLY DOOR AT ST JOSEPH'S - The opening times of the Holy Door this week are Monday to Friday 11am-1pm, Saturday 1.30pm-5pm, and Sunday 9.30am-12pm.

First Reading: Isaiah 62:1-5

'The Lord delights in you.'

For Sion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet, until her righteousness goes forth as brightness, and her salvation as a burning torch.

The nations shall see your righteousness, and all the kings your glory, and you shall be called by a new name that the mouth of the Lord will give.

You shall be a crown of beauty in the hand of the Lord, and a royal diadem in the hand of your God.

You shall no more be termed Forsaken, and your land shall no more be termed Desolate, but you shall be called My Delight Is in Her, and your land Married; for the Lord delights in you, and your land shall be married.

For as a young man marries a young woman, so shall your sons marry you, and as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride, so shall your God rejoice over you.

Response: Proclaim the wonders of the Lord among all the peoples.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:4-11

'The one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as he wills.'

Brothers and Sisters: There are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. For to one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the ability to distinguish between spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are empowered by one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as he wills.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia! God called us through the gospel, so that we may obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. Alleluia!

Gospel Reading John 2:1-11

'This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee.'

At that time: There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus also was invited to the wedding with his disciples. When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.'

Now there were six stone water jars there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding seventy or one hundred litres. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. And he said to them, 'Now draw some out and take it to the master of the feast.' So they took it. When the master of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and when people have drunk freely, then the poor wine. But you have kept the good wine until now.'

This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory. And his disciples believed in him.

REFLECTION

"This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee".

Weddings are special moments in the lives of two people who love each other. During the ceremony there is the giving of a ring, sometimes two, as a sign of the commitment they are making. A ring is a circle, it has no end, and it symbolises the everlasting nature of the love they share. In the Bible there are many references to marriage and the love and faithfulness between the bridegroom and bride, so important in marriage, is also used as a symbol of the covenant between God and His chosen people.

Today's readings are centered round weddings and gifts. In the passage from Isaiah, we have the image of a city adorned with gifts from God. It is a very personal passage as if the city were a living person. In a sense the gifts are human gifts; a new name, a new image, a city no longer forsaken or desolate but rejoiced in by the Lord. He uses the language of marriage to show the closeness of God's relationship to His people, he foresees the time when God will rejoice, as a bridegroom rejoices over his bride.

Paul speaks to us of the variety of gifts and services that are part of the person we are. We do not possess every gift but, especially in a marriage, if we share our gifts with each other our relationship will thrive. In our church communities there are many gifts and talents, if a community is united then each separate need in the church can be met and used to prepare our church for the challenges that the coming years will bring.

John uses a series of signs to show that Jesus is the Son of God. Today, in a scene set within a wedding feast he begins to show his power. Through the intervention of his mother, Mary, he shows his love for the bride and groom by changing water into wine, thus averting a great dishonour to the wedding party. There is a greater sign here. The abundance of the new wine represents the bountiful love of God which is poured out over His people. The wine of the Old Testament has run out and is replaced by the new wine that Jesus brings to us. Let us celebrate the great gift that we have been given and bring all our gifts to the service of Our Lord.


We can learn from this story that we should listen to our parents. Jesus is God and even He obeys His mother!
