JUBILEE 2025 - PILGRIMS OF HOPE - Pope Francis has announced that next years Jubilee will have the theme Pilgrims of Hope. Similar to the last Holy year, he has also enabled Bishops throughout the world to open Holy Doors in their own dioceses so that all of the faithful can participate. Bishop Stephen has asked our parish to welcome pilgrims during this Year of Jubilee and that a Holy Door be opened at St Joseph's Church.

Further to our meeting in which we discussed the practicalities as a parish of hosting the Holy Door, we have established a team of volunteers for each day who will be able to act as welcomers. The welcomers will open the church, prepare for Mass and simply be a presence in the church whilst it is open. There is still need for further volunteers to join the teams, if you are able to help with this, please contact Laura in the office. In addition to our own volunteers, Bishop Stephen has requested for priests and laity from around the diocese to support us in welcoming pilgrims. Initially it is thought that the Holy Door will be open every day, Monday to Friday 11am-2.30pm, Saturday 1pm-5pm, and Sunday 9.30am-Noon.

ADVENT COURSE: JOURNEY TO THE CRIB WITH LUKE'S

GOSPEL - Many of us have heard the Christmas story so often we're sometimes in danger of taking it for granted or overlooking key parts of the story. But do we really know the story as Luke intended? In this series of four talks, we will look again and reflect on the Infancy Narratives of Luke, Chapters 1 and 2. We will meet characters such as Zechariah and Elizabeth, John the Baptist, the shepherd's, the angels, Anna and Simeon. We will look at the four great canticles of Luke's Gospel; the Magnificat, the Benedictus, the Gloria and the Nunc Dimittis. Join us in the Day Chapel on Monday evenings 7-8pm after the 6.30pm Mass. I will make a virtuous Branch grow for David

See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I am going to fulfil the promise I made to the House of Israel and the House of Judah:

'In those days and at that time,

I will make a virtuous Branch grow for David,

who shall practise honesty and integrity in the land.

In those days Judah shall be saved

and Israel shall dwell in confidence.

And this is the name the city will be called:

The-Lord-our-integrity.'

Response: To you, O Lord, I lift up my soul.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 3:12-4:2

May you be blameless when our Lord Jesus Christ comes again

May the Lord be generous in increasing your love and make you love one another and the whole human race as much as we love you. And may he so confirm your hearts in holiness that you may be blameless in the sight of our God and Father when our Lord Jesus Christ comes with all his saints.

Finally, brothers, we urge you and appeal to you in the Lord Jesus to make more and more progress in the kind of life that you are meant to live: the life that God wants, as you learnt from us, and as you are already living it. You have not forgotten the instructions we gave you on the authority of the Lord Jesus.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia! Let us see, O Lord, your mercy and give us your saving help. Alleluia!

Gospel Reading Luke 21:25-28,34-36

That day will be sprung on you suddenly, like a trap

Jesus said to his disciples: 'There will be signs in the sun and moon and stars; on earth nations in agony, bewildered by the clamour of the ocean and its waves; men dying of fear as they await what menaces the world, for the powers of heaven will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. When these things begin to take place, stand erect, hold your heads high, because your liberation is near at hand.

'Watch yourselves, or your hearts will be coarsened with debauchery and drunkenness and the cares of life, and that day will be sprung on you suddenly, like a trap. For it will come down on every living man on the face of the earth. Stay awake, praying at all times for the strength to survive all that is going to happen, and to stand with confidence before the Son of Man.'

REFLECTION

We are at the beginning of a journey through the Gospel of Saint Luke which will lead us, initially, through the weeks of Advent to the coming of Our Saviour Jesus Christ. We will meet people on our journey who will light the way. We are also on a journey to the revelation of God's plan for humanity, shrouded in mystery, all will be revealed in due time.

God's revelation was made first to the Jewish people and so the first reading of Advent is from the Book of Jeremiah. Jerimiah speaks to his people promising them a great future with the coming of the Messiah, "a righteous branch to spring up from David", he urges the people to keep faith. But the people fail to respond, and their fate is deportation to Babylon, leaving Jerusalem in ruins.

Paul begins with a prayer. He prays that their love will grow and that they be filled with the holiness that comes from God. A new covenant with God is being established, the message that Paul is taking to all who will listen is that this is a new time, the old time has gone, the boundaries have been broken, and all, jews and gentiles, will be reborn into a new creation.

Often, in the Gospels, Jesus uses exaggerated language to raise people's awareness that change is coming. The apostles are moving towards Jerusalem and He is continually warning them of what is to come but, like the Jews of Jeremiah's time they are not listening. He is signalling the end of the present time and of the emergence of a new day when those who are faithful will emerge from captivity to freedom. But He warns them to "Stay awake and keep praying" for their reward will be "to stand before the Son of Man.


