History

This term we will learning about Victorian Britain and the Industrial Revolution. This topic allows pupils to explore a significant turning point in British history which shaped the nation. Pupils will understand how people's lives have changed and how creations, such as railways, have helped to shape the wider world.

ICT

This term we will investigate and discuss online safety and its importance. Coding knowledge will also be extended learning how to debug and create games.

English

Setting descriptions- we will start the year by exploring different settings in stories and writing descriptive settings using a variety of features. We will then spend the rest of the term developing our writing skills within autobiographical, discursive speech and poetry writing.

Grammar- alongside revising and reviewing previous knowledge we will learn 'passive' voice e.g. The window was broken by the golf ball. Linking ideas across paragraphs with a wide range of cohesive devices.

Spelling- consolidating all spellings from statutory word lists. A focus on spelling patterns such as words ending in -able and -ible and words with the /i:/ sound spelt ei after c.

PE (Mondays and Wednesdays)

Dance - We will look at the art of designing a sequence of movements/actions that are used to perform a dance.

Tag Rugby - understand the rules of the game and participate in full games alongside understanding the importance of keeping in a line in both attacking and defending plays.

Music

We will look at the genres of Pop/Motown, Jazz, Latin, Blues listening to and appraising songs/music alongside improvision and composition using a variety of instruments.

Maths

Using the White Rose Maths Scheme we This term we will focus on the Place Value of numbers and securing and extending our knowledge. The 4 number operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division will also be key objectives. We hope to also begin our Fractions work.

SCIENCE: Topics this term have a biology focus - Living Things. We will learn the basic form of classification, cell construction and know that living things can be unicellular or multicellular. Children will learn what an organism is and will be able to name some. Animals and Humans. We will study human circulatory system, and describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood. Also, the impact of diet exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their body functions.

RE

Our three topics we will explore this term are: Loving, Vocation & Commitments and Expectations. Pupils will consider how Christian belief impacts on actions and children will be encouraged to make links between scripture and life. Children will have opportunities to share their own opinions and experiences and to ask and answer questions about Christian beliefs.

<u>PSHE</u>

Created and Loved by God explores the individual. Rooted in the teaching that we are made in the image and likeness of God, it helps children to develop an understanding of the importance of valuing themselves as the basis for personal relationships.
