And RSE (Relationships and Sex Education	Year 5 - 'Memorial Sacrifice'. In 'Memorial Sacrifice' we learn more about the Eucharist and how it keeps the memory of Jesus alive and present. The Big Questions are: Why do we need memories? Year 6 – 'Unity.' In Unity, we learn more about how the Eucharist enables people to live in communion. Big questions are: Why are we happiest when we are united? In RSE we will continue use Ten-Ten.	Speak to your child about what they have learnt during the lessons. Children MUST confidently know times tables – please encourage them to learn them at home. On Seesaw there is a maths knowledge organiser. This would be great for children to continue to learn from on a regular basis.
ABC MAR AND	This half term we are excited to be introducing a new writing scheme created by 'Curriculum by Unity Partnership' (CUSP). CUSP is built around the belief that every child should be taught the key skills and techniques to be able to write effectively. The curriculum is carefully structured to ensure pupils build upon prior knowledge to master writing and develop their ideas. Within lessons, subject knowledge runs through each unit, learning and rehearsing key skills, which in turn children apply to well-planned pieces of writing.	If children are completing any work at home, please encourage high standards. Reading – please ensure you read with/ensure your child reads 3 times per week and uploads comments on to Seesaw.
	Year 5 will be finishing 'Forces'. They will then continue to explore 'Sound Waves and the Structure of the Ear'. In Sound, the children will recall the different structures of the ear and the function of each part, explain how sound waves can be modelled and describe what happens to a sound wave over time.
