RE topics for the term are:



We will be using our nursery bear which a child can take home and show what they do at home on a weekend. We will have real-life pictures of bears in the classroom. We will also play listening games to recognise different animal sounds.	Talk to your child about what you will do today or things you may see on your way to school. When you have the nursery bear, encourage your child to show the bear where they live, what is their favourite toy and who lives in their family.

There will be a range of books available for the children to access within the room and explore individually or with an adult. Children will continue to join in with nursery rhymes and rhyming stories.	Encourage your child to write their first name at home. Read stories with your child at home. Sing nursery rhymes together at home.
