YEAR 3/4 SPRING NEWSLETTER

MATHS

The children will be focusing on multiplication and division.

Y3 – multiply and divide 2-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers.

Y4 – multiply and divide 3-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers.

Pupils will also learn to convert between different units of measurement including millimetres, centimetres, metres and kilometres as well as looking at length and perimeter.

ENGUSH

Writing to inform - Children will write a thank you letter to Santa and a newspaper article based on a fairy tale.

Writing to entertain - Children will write an adventure narrative about going on a journey and a poem about kindness.

Our class novel this term is 'The Boy at the Back of the Class' by Onjali Q. Rauf.

RE

In RE we will be focusing on the following topics:

Y3 - Journeys

We will explore the Christian family's journey with Jesus through the Church's year. Our big question this term is 'Is life a journey?'.

Y4 – Community

We will explore what it means to be part of a community and the ways in which people may serve their parish community. Our big question this term is 'What makes a community?'.

SCIENCE

Y3 - This term we will be learning about light and seeing. Children will learn about light and dark. We will also explore shadows and reflections as well as the how light can affect them.

Y4 – This term we will be learning about Sound. Children will learn what a sound is and how we hear. We will also investigate the volume and pitch of a sound.

GEOGRAPHY

In Geography we will be learning about rivers. Children will explore the process of erosion and its role in the formation of different features such as waterfalls. We will look at different rivers around the world and ways in which the flooding of rivers can be prevented.

COMPUTTING

In computing we will be continuing to follow the Purple Mash scheme of work. This term we will be focusing on emails. After learning how to open and respond to an email, children will develop knowledge of how to use email safely. Children will learn how to add attachments as well as what the terms CC and BCC mean.

Flower sculptures - Children will create a colourful flower sculpture inspired by the artist Yayoi Kusama.




Football and Netball
