Vocabulary

Ancient- belonging to a very distant pass and no longer in existence.

BC- before Christ.

AD- Anno Domini- after the Lord.

Architecture- art of constructing buildings.

River Nile- Longest river in the world. Based in Africa. Essential to Ancient Egyptians life.

Pharaoh- a ruler of Ancient Egypt.

Hieroglyphics- symbols in writing of the Ancient Egyptians.

God/Goddess- Higher beings in the Ancient Egyptian faith.

Tomb- a large vault for burying the dead.

Pyramid- One of the seven wonders of the world.

Canopic Jar- a covered urn containing organs from an embalmed body.

Mummification- a process in which the skin and flesh of a corpse can be preserved.

Death Mask- a plaster cast taken of a dead person's face, used to make a mask or model.

Archaeologist- a person who studies human history and prehistory through the excavation of sites.
