Our Learning this week:

Year 6 have been working hard in school and at home! In English, we have been studying the poem 'The Great Realisation', and are writing their own version of the poem based on events in 2020. In Maths we have been revising work on decimal places, and well as lots of Arithmetic. We have started a new History topic all about the Vikings, and a new Science topic about Evolution. We are going to be looking at the artist Banksy too, and hopefully produce some great artwork!

Year 5 have enjoyed looking at Greek Monster hybrids, multiplication, African art and have started to look at Benin in History

Year 4 have been working so hard at home and in school. We have started to read The Train to Impossible Places by P.G. Bell and are really enjoying the story so far. Year 2 have been reading lots of Roald Dahl poems. They have also started their new topic about the Great Fire of London and continued with living things in their habitats. It's been great to see all the home learning taking place and remember if you need help with any-thing let Mr. Turner know.

Year 1 children have been creating colour wheels and exploring shades of primary and secondary colours.

Year R have started to learn all about dinosaurs. They have been drawing dinosaurs to make an information book, painted dinosaurs and learnt some dinosaur dances. In maths they have been learning about zero. In RE the children have drawn pictures showing the three wise men visiting baby Jesus

In **Nursery** the children have been investigating ice. We left bowls of water outside to freeze and made predictions as to what would happen. They have had fun painting the ice and frosty ground whilst practising mark making.
