To locate some important physical geographical features of UK: Location of longest river of UK, River Severn, river Thames, River Ribble, Ben Nevis, the highest mountain, the Pennines, Forest of Dean in Gloucestershire, Durdle door Jurassic Coast, Dorset.

The local area is in the North west of England and it is part of Lancashire, the village of Clapham is in Yorkshire. The Pennines separate Lancashire and Yorkshire
