	 Regular modelling and demonstration of pronunciation during lessons.
	Using visual aids to assist learning.
	 Breaking learning down into smaller steps where possible to support effective learning and knowledge retention.
	 Providing SEN learners with extra time to complete tasks (when needed) to ensure each child achieves.
	Regular check ins with children to assess their understanding.
	Providing a positive and supportive learning environment.
