SEN is not considered a limiting factor, and all children are encouraged to participate fully in exploring music of different genres, cultures and in using a variety of instruments. | <ul> <li>A spiral curriculum which supports the revisiting and reinforcement of key learning over time.</li> <li>Revisiting key vocabulary throughout the lesson.</li> <li>Carefully sequenced learning steps and task plans to support planning and independence.</li> <li>Placing children in mixed ability pairs/ groups to encourage peer to peer support.</li> <li>Breaking learning down into smaller steps where possible to support effective learning and knowledge retention.</li> <li>Providing SEN learners with extra time to complete tasks (when needed) to ensure each child achieves.</li> <li>Extra time to repeat listening to stimulus music, to form opinions, to experiment with tuned and untuned instruments.</li> <li>Demonstrating and encouraging a can-do, resilient attitude, particularly when performing.</li> <li>Supporting children to express how the music makes them feel.</li> <li>Regular modelling and demonstrating of expected skills during lessons.</li> <li>Providing a positive and supportive learning environment.</li> </ul> |
