Discussing higher level vocabulary. Providing a range of differentiated questions during whole class guided reading so that all children can achieve. Providing high quality interventions that help improve decoding and fluency skills. Regular recaps and discussions to check SEN children's understanding. Providing a positive learning environment where children feel comfortable with sharing ideas. Ensuring children have access to equipment that will support their learning (overlays, talking tins). Pairing children with more able readers to build their confidence.
