We do this by providing writing opportunities that ignite children's imaginations and encourage them to see a purpose for their writing regardless of their ability.	<ul> <li>Providing children with resources that are suitable for their ability, such as word banks, scaffolding and sentence starters.</li> <li>Pre-teaching or same day intervention when required.</li> <li>Providing verbal feedback during lessons to support children with their independent writing.</li> <li>A spiral curriculum which supports the revisiting and reinforcement of key learning over time.</li> <li>Carefully sequenced learning steps to support planning and independence.</li> <li>Starters at the start of every lesson to help embed prior learning.</li> <li>Modelling and demonstrating the skills being taught.</li> <li>The use of model texts to help children develop their ideas.</li> <li>Breaking down learning into smaller steps to enable all children to develop independence and a sense of achievement.</li> <li>Supporting children with sounding out words phonetically.</li> <li>Lots of opportunities to discuss their ideas during lessons.</li> <li>Placing children in mixed ability pairs/ groups to encourage conversations when discussing their ideas.</li> <li>Providing a positive and supporting learning environment.</li> </ul>
