Your child's attendance this year is:

Research shows that positive attendance directly correlates with positive outcomes for pupils. To enable us to maximize our impact as a school, we really emphasize to our students that attendance matters.

## Our whole school target for attendance is 97%

I have provided the table below to provide some clarity and meaning behind the number.

- If your child is in the green band your child will be doing well and should be congratulated.
- If your child is in the amber band they are doing well but they should be aiming to move into the green band
- If your child's attendance is in the red band this is a cause for concern. This puts your child at a disadvantage and requires school support and/or intervention.

Our support is very much personalized; we recognize that attendance is a % but the issues behind the number are what will navigate our support and actions. Consequently, any pupils who have been **persistently absent (under 90%)** or **severely absent (under 50%)** this year will have their attendance closely monitored throughout the next academic year of 2023-2024 and we ask that you work with us to remove any barriers which may have prevented them from attending school. In similar fashion, I would like to congratulate pupils who have attended school regularly throughout this year, it hasn't gone unnoticed! Positive attendance will weave through all aspects of our reward system next year; it will be an essential criterion to attend reward trips and/or school events.
