From Laudato Si .. In 1971, eight years after Pacem in Terris, Blessed Pope Paul VI referred to the ecological concern as "a tragic consequence" of unchecked human activity: "Due to an ill-considered exploitation of nature, humanity runs the risk of destroying it and becoming in turn a victim of this degradation".

So what does this mean?

The world and its resources exist for the benefit of mankind and it has been entrusted to the stewardship of mankind collectively.

The role of steward places an obligation to make wise use of resources and to ensure that the interests of others and of subsequent generations are considered justly and fairly, not putting profit before people. People of today and of future generations depend on the earth and therefore the impact of human activity on the earth must be wisely managed.

On the next slide you will find information about renewable energy. What can we, as stewards and trustees of God, do to stop the exploitation of nature?
