This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

- Students receive 1 hour per week at KS3 and curriculum is informed by the MMC
- Students can opt for GCSE Music at the end of Year 9
- At KS3, students have regular opportunities to learn Keyboard, Guitar, Ukulele and Vocal skills in a mix of both whole class and solo performance opportunities
- Students are offered the opportunity to sign up for Instrumental lessons through Anthem, our peripatetic offering to learn any instrument; Singing, Piano, Keyboard, Guitar, Drums, etc. LAC have instrumental lessons paid for by school

Part B: Extra-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

- Students are offered the opportunity to sign up for Instrumental lessons through Anthem, our peripatetic offering to learn any instrument; Singing, Piano, Keyboard, Guitar, Drums, etc. LAC have instrumental lessons paid for by school
- Ensembles- Students have various opportunities to join clubs including general choir, senior choir (Year 9 and above only and more difficult three part harmony repertoire), Open mic club and Keyboard club.
- Students can complete graded exams with the instrumental teachers if they wish
- Students are free to use school practice rooms and instruments to rehearse and do their own music making outside of school specific clubs and ensembles.

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

- Students are given multiple opportunities to perform; Advent service, Battle of the Bands, Open Evening and other whole school events, weekly mass and assemblies where students are able.
- We offer a twice yearly trip to the theatre to reward all students who have participated in whole school events.
- All students participate in singing the school hymn every week

In the future

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.

- With investment or support from Local Hub could look at offering a wider variety of instrumental teaching in whole class settings, e.g. Bass Guitar for 25-26
- Regularly review and update the extra-curricular timetable to reflect cohort of children and offer a different instrumental club
