

## Remote Learning Provision

<b>Art</b>	A series of sequenced lesson activities and resources are uploaded to EduLink relative to a pupil's timetable. Pre-recorded and live lessons will take place via Microsoft Teams to provide a broad and balanced curriculum experience.	The majority of lessons will be of a blended approach. The start/end of the lesson will be live, allowing pupils to work independently. Pupils will be able to come back into the teams chat if they need any specific help with their task. <b>KS3</b> 1 lesson per week <b>KS4</b> 2-5 lessons per week

<b>English</b>	Best choice from a range of pre-recorded lessons (BBC Bitesize, Oak Academy, Pearson Education), producing and narrating our own PowerPoints, Quizlet Live, text-based activities (questions on PP or Word, pupils write their responses and submit on Teams. Different pre-recorded resources allocated to the pupils in the same class to differentiate (10J for example).	<b>KS3</b> Minimum of one hour per week, per class. <b>KS4</b> Minimum of one hour per week, per class.
<b>Geography</b>	Mixture of lessons and resources uploaded to Edulink and pre-recorded lessons as well as live lessons.	<b>KS3</b> Minimum of one hour per week <b>KS4</b> Minimum of one hour per week

<b>History</b>	Mixture of lessons and resources uploaded to Edulink and pre-recorded lessons as well as live lessons. No external provider (e.g. The EverLearner) as of yet.	<b>KS3</b> Minimum 1 per fortnight for KS3 classes <b>KS4</b> minimum 3 per fortnight for classes, depending on the class, numbers absent and length of absence.
<b>Maths</b>	Mixture of lessons and resources uploaded to Edulink and pre-recorded lessons via White rose Maths, Oak academy and use of mymaths.	<b>KS3</b> Minimum 1 per fortnight for KS3 classes <b>KS4</b> Minimum 1 per fortnight for KS4 classes. We are using electronic whiteboards to demo and model
<b>Modern Foreign Languages</b>	Pre-recorded or live lesson (one per week), use of Edulink for consolidation lessons.	<b>KS3</b> 1 live lesson per week <b>KS4</b> minimum 1 live lesson per week
<b>Music</b>	Use of Focus on Sound for all year groups. Customized content from FoS provides interactive and in-depth work for all year groups, including KS4 specific to their syllabus. Some video lessons from Oak academy for Y7/8	<b>KS4</b> Fortnightly KS4 lessons for content pertaining to the Listening component of the GCSE (40% of the overall mark)
<b>Physical Education</b>	<b>KS3</b> Choice of active mile, fitness video or circuit. 1 live lesson per week with the pupils. (Video) Theory tasks set on Edulink eg. Feedback and areas to develop. GCSE - mixture of tasks using resources on Edulink and EverLearner.  <b>KS4</b> Choice of active mile, fitness video or circuit. Theory tasks set on Edulink eg. Feedback and areas to develop.	<b>KS4</b> At least one live lesson per week for GCSE.
<b>PSHE</b>	Pupils in all classes have weekly wellbeing check ins with form tutors. This is to check that pupils are well and coping with the current situation. It is also a way of checking workload with pupils. Citizenship lessons from the Oak Academy are being uploaded for pupils to access more interactive lessons.

<b>Science</b>	<p>Y7 &amp; Y8 Combination of Edulink and live lessons. <b>Technology</b>	<p>Mixture of lessons and resources uploaded to Teams, pre-recorded and live lessons as required. Use of PG Online for DT, a purchased resource for use with KS3 &amp; 4 lessons. These include power points, video links, worksheets, homework sheets and answer sheets uploaded to Edulink.</p>	<p>1 lesson per class per week.</p>
<b>Food</b>	<p>Mixture of lessons and resources uploaded Edulink using the following: Booklet work, BBC Bitesize, BBC Programs – iplayer, Food A Fact of Life, Seneca learning and The Nutrition program.</p>	<p>1 live lesson for Year 10</p>
