

We eat sardens and fish and tomatoes. Finally I went to sleep and I slept at the straw roof in till I fell to sleep into the next day.



## Written report - witnessing a volcanic eruption






**Instructions:** Imagine that you have witnessed a volcanic eruption. Write a short report about the eruption. Try to answer some of the following questions in your report.




