Covid 19

Thank you to all the parents who are now wearing face masks when dropping off and collecting your children. Please continue to support us in this request.

Just to remind you that if your child displays any of the three main Covid symptoms (a high temperature, a new, continuous cough or changes to their sense of taste and smell), you must not send your child to school and should arrange a Covid test.

We are very mindful about the procedures for you to inform school if your child tests positive out of school hours – in the evening, weekend or in the holidays. The school app is not manned out of school hours. We have therefore set up a specific email address which will be monitored by the senior leadership team for you to inform us if your child tests positive for Covid out of school hours. The address is covidpositive@st-clares.manchester.sch.uk Please note staff will only respond to you out of school hours if your child has tested positive to Covid. Please do not use this email to ask whether or not your child should go for a test. If your child is showing any of the three main Covid symptoms, you must arrange for them to have a test.

You should have all received the information last week about our approach to remote learning and how you can access your child's work from home. The information is also on our website.
