Attendance

Attendance this week for the whole school is 93.5% . Three classes -4S, 6F and 6S - have the best attendance this week with 97% so a huge well done to them.

Covid 19

We are still following the Covid guidelines set by the government and advice from Manchester LA. If your child develops a high temperature, a new, continuous cough or their sense of smell or taste changes, they need to take a PCR test. Your child only has to be displaying one of the three symptoms. They should not be sent into school until they have a negative PCR test or they have completed their isolation period. Children will still be sent home from school if they are displaying any of these symptoms.

We will send you a 'Warn and Inform' letter should someone in your child's class test positive for Covid.

Important new information from Manchester: As rates are increasing, Manchester have requested that we ensure that any household members who are **close contacts of a positive case in KS2**, who are exempt from isolation and are attending school **should carry out daily lateral flow testing for 10 days** after the onset of symptoms (or positive test if asymptomatic) in the case in their household, and only attend school if their lateral flow test is negative. They are also encouraged to follow national guidance for all contacts and access a PCR test. **Visitors coming into school will be required to wear masks.** This advice will be reviewed in one week.

Parents RWI session

Reception parents are invited to a Read Write Inc information session which is being presented by our Reception staff. It will give you an overview of the scheme and how you can support your child's reading at home. If you are unable to attend, please notify your child's teacher and they will send the handouts to you. The session will be hold on **Thursday 2nd December from 3.30-4.00 pm**.

Safety

As you are aware, we were notified of a possible failed abduction at a local primary school this week. Please speak to your child about 'Stranger Danger' and that they need to shout loudly if they feel anxious or afraid because of an unknown adult's actions around them. Please consider whether it is safe for your child to walk home on a pass – particularly as the dark nights draw in. Remind your children to come back into school if they walk to meet you and you are not there or they feel anxious or scared. We do not want to frighten our children, but they do need to be mindful of starngers.
