Attendance

Lunch boxes

Please can I ask you to be mindful of what you put into your child's lunch boxes. Staff are reporting that some children have too many sugary treats to eat. We want to encourage healthy eating and for the children to understand the need for a healthy diet. Small treats are part of a balanced diet in moderation. **May I also remind you that we are a nut free school**, so please check ingredients before sending food items into school.

Raffle Tickets

Our church is unable to hold a Christmas Fair this year, but they are still organising a raffle. They have asked that we help them with this fundraiser as we do each year. Each child has brought a book of raffle tickets home today which we would ask you to buy. They cost £1 for the book. Thank you for your support with this. Our parish church funds have helped us to support families in need from our school this year for which we are very grateful.

Behaviour Policy

We have updated our behaviour policy and now focus on three easy to remember rules which are: Be Ready, Be Respectful and Be Safe. Although the rules are simple, they cover a lot of different aspects of school life for example:

Be ready:

Children are to attend school on time.

Children are to be wearing the correct uniform.

Children are to be ready to learn with the correct resources / equipment.

Children have positive attitude and show determination and resilience.

Children are ready to be the best person they can be.

Be respectful:

Children are polite to everyone.

Children display good manners

Children listen to everyone and respect the views of others.

Children follow teacher's instructions immediately and sensibly.

Children respect the property of others

Children respect and care for the school environment.

Be safe:

Children follow rules and routines for health and safety.

Children have kind hands, kind feet and kind words.

Children ensure that they stay in supervised areas.

Children act as a positive role model and question 'What would Jesus do?'

Covid 19

Covid restrictions were changed by the government this week due to the new variant.

If you come into school at all, even to our reception desk, you must wear a face covering unless you are exempt from doing so. If you come into contact with anyone who tests positive with the new Omicron variant, you must isolate for 10 days irrespective of your vaccination status.

We are also being asked to carry out daily lateral flow tests if you are a close contact of anyone else who is Covid positive, even if you are double jabbed.

Please remember that if your child develops a high temperature, a new, continuous cough or their sense of smell or taste changes, they need to take a PCR test. Your child only has to be displaying one of the three symptoms. They should not be sent into school until they have a negative PCR test or they have completed their isolation period. Children will still be sent home from school if they are displaying any of these symptoms.

We will send you a 'Warn and Inform' letter should someone in your child's class test positive for Covid.

As a school we are here to support your child academically, spiritually and emotionally. Christmas Performances and Safety

Providing that government guidance doesn't change, we are hoping to welcome parents back into school for some of our Christmas celebrations. In order to keep everyone as safe as possible, there will be measures put in place for attendance at school events:

- Tickets will be limited and issued for all in school events, so that we can welcome you as safely as possible.
 WE WILL ONLY BE ALLOWING ONE TICKET PER CHILD FOR MOST OF THE EVENTS. YOU WILL NOT BE
 ALLOWED TO ENTER THE PREMISES WITHOUT A TICKET. You will receive information about how to book a ticket on the school gateway app.
- There will be a choice of two dates for most events to limit numbers.
- All visitors must wear a face covering whilst in school unless you are exempt.
- We will ask you to sanitise your hands on entry to the building.
- Windows will be kept open to improve ventilation.
- We ask that you do NOT enter the school premises if you are unwell or displaying any of the 3 main Covid symptoms.
- We encourage you to do a lateral flow test prior to coming to watch a performance.
