Whole school attendance for this week is 97% with Year 6F having 100% attendance. Well done! The whole school attendance for the autumn term is 97.3%

### **Swimming**

The swimming programme for Year 4 will begin again during the first week of the new term on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> January. In order to avoid any confusion and maximise safety, we have decided that it will be easier and less confusing for the two classes to complete the swimming programme in blocks

rather than every other week. Year 4RW will go first and swim for one hour every Thursday for the whole of the spring term – up to the Easter break. After Easter, Year 4B will take over and begin their course of lessons. Girls will need a swimming costume and swimming hat; boys will need swimming trunks (not holiday shorts). The instructors will no longer be able to loan swimming hats to the girls who may have forgetten them. Swimming goggles are only permitted if a doctor provides a note. The swimming baths have a strict risk assessment in place.

## School re-opening in January

Please note that children return to school after the Christmas break on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> January at the normal staggered start times. You may have seen in the news that high schools will be teaching many year groups remotely for the first week back. This does not apply to primary schools – we will be open as normal. Please ensure that your child is punctual and ready for their 8.45am or 9.00am start. We do not want to miss any vital learning time.

Finally, on behalf of all the staff and governors of St Clare's we wish you a very Happy, Holy and Peaceful Christmas. We thank you for your support this term and your good wishes.
