Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is 93.5%. The best class for attendance this week is 4S with 99.3%. They are also the best class this half term with an overall attendance of 97.2%. Well done 4S!

Covid 19

Covid restrictions were changed by the government again this week.

If you come into school at all, even to our reception desk, you must wear a face covering unless you are exempt from doing so. If you come into contact with anyone who tests positive with Covid, you should do daily lateral flow tests. You no longer need to isolate if you are a close contact of someone who has tested positive with the Omicron variant. You are asked to carry out daily lateral flow tests for 10 days.

Please remember that if your child develops a high temperature, a new, continuous cough or their sense of smell or taste changes, they need to take a PCR test. Your child only has to be displaying one of the three symptoms. They should not be sent into school until they have a negative PCR test or they have completed their isolation period. Children will still be sent home from school if they are displaying any of these symptoms. There are many more symptoms that children display when Covid positive, so if your child is unwell we would recommend a lateral flow test or PCR.

We will send you a 'Warn and Inform' letter should someone in your child's class test positive for Covid.

Young Voices

We have just received notification from Young Voices that our performance scheduled for February will be postponed due to Covid. We are awaiting further details as to when they hope to re-schedule the concert. Purchased tickets will still be valid for the new date. As soon as we know any more, we will notify you.

Support

As a school we are here to support your child academically, spiritually and emotionally. If you are in need of any support, any support at all - this could be food or clothing – you must contact us at school. We may be able to help you and will not make judgements. If we cannot help you, we know of many agencies that can offer support including our own church. Please contact Mrs Sylvester for a discrete conversation if you require support.

Christmas Performances and Safety

The only remaining performance for next week is our music showcase on Monday morning. The following restrictions still apply.

- Tickets will be limited and issued for all in school events, so that we can welcome you as safely as possible.
 WE WILL ONLY BE ALLOWING ONE TICKET PER CHILD IF THEY ARE PLAYING AN INSTRUMENT. YOU WILL
 NOT BE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE PREMISES WITHOUT A TICKET.
- All visitors must wear a face covering whilst in school unless you are exempt.
- We will ask you to sanitise your hands on entry to the building.
- Windows will be kept open to improve ventilation.
- We ask that you do NOT enter the school premises if you are unwell or displaying any of the 3 main Covid symptoms.
- We encourage you to do a lateral flow test prior to coming to watch a performance.
