Dear Parents / Carers,

This week has been Safer Internet Day and Mental Health Week. The children have completed tasks to help them with both these important areas. In Reception, they held a Wellbeing Wednesday afternoon where the children chose the activities for the afternoon. They included painting, singing and making paper dolls. Year 2 are studying aspects of life in Zambia, so that they compare it to life here in Blackley. As part of their Viking topic, Year 4 made Runes stones out of clay using the Runes code for their initials. As part of their wellbeing work, Year 6 painted balloons with the names of the people who lift or support them around them. They also linked up to the BBCs live wellbeing lesson.

Assembly

This week our assembly was linked to Safer Internet Day and was led by our Digital Leaders. The assemblies were inactive and encouraged the children to think about how to be safe and respectful whilst online. They were reminded of what to do if something concerns them; never to reveal any personal details; and of the age restrictions on games. World Book Day

This year we will be celebrating World Book Day on **Thursday 3rd March**. The theme of the day is 'you are a reader.' The whole school will be doing activities linked to the book 'On a Magical Day Do Nothing.' The book is about a child who goes outside in the rain and explores the great outdoors as opposed to staying in playing with technology all the time. Children may come to school dressed up in 'rain' clothing to link to our book if they choose. Alternatively, they can wear a book character outfit or night-wear linked to the theme of bedtime stories. The choice is yours!

Uniform

Most of our children look really smart in their correct school uniform. May I remind you that school uniform is black or charcoal trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore; a blue polo shirt; and a blue school cardigan or jumper. Black shoes (not trainers or boots) should be worn.

For PE, the children must wear a plain white, round neck t-shirt with black shorts and plain black pumps. As children are still coming into school in their PE kits, they may wear black or grey leggings / tracksuit bottoms and a black or grey sweatshirt. Trainers must be black. The children should not have any logos on their PE kit.

If children are not wearing the correct uniform, we will ask them to change into spare kits that we have in school. Thank you for your support in this matter.

Access road

Please do NOT walk down the access road in between the school and the church. It is a road and cars are frequently coming in and out of the car park. Access is via the front Key Stage 2 playground – follow the markings on the floor and the zebra crossing that are there to show the route. We would not walk our children down the middle of the road on Victoria Avenue, so please do not walk on this side road. We want to teach the children road safety and keep them safe. Thank you for your support in this matter.

Covid 19

If you come into school at all, even to our reception desk, you **must wear a face covering** unless you are exempt from doing so. If you are coming into school for any scheduled visits (e.g meetings or assemblies), you will be required to take a lateral flow test and show us proof of a negative result. If you come into contact with anyone who tests positive with Covid, you should do daily lateral flow tests for seven days.

Please remember that if your child develops a high temperature, a new, continuous cough or their sense of smell or taste changes, they need to take a PCR test. Your child only has to be displaying one of the three symptoms. They should not be sent into school until they have a negative PCR test or they have completed their isolation period. Children will still be sent home from school if they are displaying any of these symptoms. There are many more symptoms that children display when Covid positive, so if your child is unwell we would recommend a lateral flow test or PCR.

We will send you a 'Warn and Inform' letter should someone in your child's class test positive for Covid.

Support

We know that families may experience difficult times and difficult situations throughout a year. As a school, we are part of the local community along with our church. We are here primarily to educate and support our children, but that extends to their families too. We are here to support you in any way we can - should you need it.
