Dear Parents / Carers,

Thank you to everyone who attended parents evening this week. It is really important to have a chance to speak to your child's class teacher about your child – their wellbeing, their progress, their attainment and how we can both support them in their learning. Staff are available for you to raise concerns with throughout the year, but this meeting informs you of where your child is in terms of national expected standards. As parents you play a key role, along with school, in the education of your child, so thank you for your support. In Reception, we now have eight chicks that have hatched from the eggs. The children have been mesmorised by them. This week, Reception children have also made Easter bonnets which they paraded wearing. They were fantastic and very creative. Year 1 have made chocolate rice crispie nests which they didn't seem to want to share with staff. They used the experience to write instructions on how to make them. Year 2 have been learning about plants, the inside of seeds and are investigating what helps plants grow. The children were using amazing scientific language like germination and photosynthesis. Year 4 have been doing class debates using persuasive language. One class focused on which pet to have whilst the other debating whether or not dams should be built. In Year 6, the children have been planning and creating questionnaires using Google Forms.

## Covid 19

The government have updated their guidance on living with Covid on:

https://www.gov.uk/government/news/government-sets-out-next-steps-for-living-with-covid which provided a little more clarity around PCR/LFD testing post April 1<sup>st</sup>. On 1 April, updated guidance advised people with symptoms of a respiratory infection, including COVID-19, and a high temperature or who feel unwell, to try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature. From 1 April, anyone with a positive COVID-19 test result will be advised to try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. Day one starts after your positive Covid test. In relation to children under the age of 18, the advice states that they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days. This starts from the day after they did the test.

## **Building work**

When we return to school after the Easter holidays, there will be workmen on site. The Key Stage 1 kitchen is being renovated into a new library and intervention room. We are also having a new corridor built on the outside of the school to enable pupils to access Nursery without walking through the two Reception classrooms. Meals will continue to be made on site in the key stage 2 building. The workmen will be on site prior to the children arriving. Please ensure that you enter school through the front playground and keep to the marked walkway. Do not walk on the road in between church and school. We want to teach the children road safety and walking on this road does not promote children's safety.

All Nursery children will enter and leave school via the back Nursery door. Parents will need to walk through the key stage 1 playground to gain access to Nursery. Thank you for your understanding and patience whilst the work is undertaken.
