Another term has come to an end – the year is passing by so quickly. The children, as always, have been resilient, kind and hardworking in what has proved to be another challenging year so far. Thank you for all your support this term.

Much of the focus this week in school has been on the significance of Holy Week – the most important time in our Church's year. The children have explored events from Palm Sunday, to Maunday Thursday, Good Friday and then to the celebration surrounded Easter Sunday. We have shared a Mass with Father Jeremiah on Tuesday and our key stage two classes followed The Stations of the Cross. The children have made Easter cards, Easter cakes, paintings, wreaths and crucifixes.

Assembly

We have held two assemblies this week. The first one focused on the story of The Three Trees. This story tells of three trees that have dreams for the future. The first wishes to be a jewellery box to hold gold and expensive jewels; the second wants to be a mighty vessel crossing stormy seas carrying kings and queens; and the third just wants to grow up tall, pointing to heaven. When the trees are chopped down, it appears that their dreams will not be realised as one is made into a feeding trough for animals; the second a small fishing boat; and the third just left to one side. It turns out that they actually exceed their own goals as the feeding trough became the manger that held the most precious jewel of all time, Jesus; the small fishing boat was the boat that Jesus was in

when he calmed the storm, so it carried the King of Love; and the third tree became the cross pointing up to heaven holding the Son of God. The message was that we, like Jesus, have to trust in God as He has plans for us all, and often they exceed our own dreams.

The second assembly focused on the events of Holy Week. The children were encouraged to think about how they would have felt had they been at any of the events. The message was how much we are all loved by God and we will be eternally happy if we follow in His ways.
