SATs Week Monday 9th - Thursday 12th May

Children in Year 6 will be sitting their Standard Assessment Tests (SATs) over the course of next week. <u>It is imperative</u> that your child is in school this week and that they arrive on time. The tests are compulsory.

The children have been well prepared for the tests and they are not something we want them to worry about. We have amazing children here at St Clare's and we know that there is so much more to them than the result of a test paper. SATs are an opportunity for the children to show their understanding of maths, reading and grammar, punctuation and spelling. The class teacher assesses their writing through their normal class work.

All Year 6 children are invited into school at 8.00am on Monday to Thursday next week. This will give them time to have something to eat in school, ask any questions and be ready for the start of the assessments. Please send your child into school for 8.00am.
