Attendance

Whole school attendance this week is 93.5% which is much lower than expected. I know that we are coming to the end of the term, but we need to maintain good attendance. We are still teaching lessons. Attendance should be above 97%. The best class this week is 2L with a magnificent 100% attendance – well done. All Year 5 classes have also had 99% attendance this week.

Staffing

As you will have seen from the class structure for next year, we are gaining and losing some staff. This summer, we say a fond farewell to Miss McDermott and Miss Nicholas. Miss Meadows will also be leaving us in the autumn term. We wish them all every success on the next stage of their life adventure and we thank them for all they have done for the pupils of St Clare's over the years. They will be missed!

As we say goodbye to some staff, we welcome some new ones. We welcome into our school community Mr Keogh, Miss Gibson, Mr Cox and Mr Aldred who will be teaching classes here from September. I know that they will be made to feel very welcome – it is a common trait with our parents, staff and children.

Heat wave

Temperatures are forecast to soar on Monday and Tuesday next week. Please ensure that your child brings water to school (which can be re-filled), wears sun cream and a sun hat. The children will be allowed to wear their PE kits on

these two days to try and keep them cooler. PE kit consists of a white t-shirt and black shorts. It is not an own clothes day, so variations to the PE kit will not be permitted.

We will keep the children out of the sun as much as possible and keep classrooms ventilated.

Reports

You should have received your child's report today. I hope that you are pleased with them. The children have worked hard over the past year – the first year of near 'normality since Covid. A number of children are not where they should be in terms of attainment due to the missed learning time as a result of Covid closures. We are still working hard to address this in class and through our intervention programmes. If your child is invited to a group, please try to attend as it will help with their 'catch up.' They will begin again in earnest in September. You can help at home by ensuring that your child reads every night, practises their phonic sounds and their times table. These are vital to your child's progression. If you need to speak with staff about the contents of your child's report, please speak to their class teacher to arrange a meeting.

Key Stage 2 SATs results

Our Year 6 children (and staff) have worked hard for their SATs which were completed in May 2022. We are very proud of all their achievements given the disruption to their education over the least two years.
