#### September

I am sure that you all saw the latest announcements regarding the lifting of restrictions from Monday 19<sup>th</sup> July. As we finish for the summer holidays on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> July, we will be keeping our current Covid measures in place. As far as we are aware, most restrictions for school will be lifted and things will return to normal in September. That means that we will not be operating in bubbles and we will remove the staggered start and finish times. We will need to retain our cleaning routine throughout the day; children regularly washing their hands; and keeping rooms ventilated.

Unless we are given any different advice, the school will re-open for the autumn term on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> September. All doors will open at 8.50am for the children to come in and prepare for the morning. There will be morning activities waiting for the children as they come into class. Registration will be taken at 9.00am, so your child must be in before 9am. Please aim to have them here at 8.50am.

#### **Attendance**

## **Important Covid information**

We have had to close another two bubbles this week due to positive Covid cases. We are seeing a rise in positive cases in our school and in the number of children going for PCR tests. Therefore, if your child shows ANY of the three main symptoms of Covid – a new cough, a temperature or changes to their sense of taste or smell - please arrange to take them for a PCR test and do NOT bring them into school. Lateral flow tests are designed for asymptomatic cases – where the person is not showing any of the main Covid symptoms, so should NOT be used if your child displays symptoms. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

There are a host of new symptoms associated with the Delta variant including diarrhoea, headache, fever and chills, shortness of breath, fatigue, body aches, sore throat, runny nose and vomiting. Manchester track and trace recommend that a PCR test is taken is you have any of these symptoms, although you do not need to isolate whilst waiting for the results with these particular symptoms.

If your child develops any Covid symptoms out of school hours, please notify us on the dedicated email: <a href="mailto:covidpositive@st-clares.manchester.sch.uk">covidpositive@st-clares.manchester.sch.uk</a> It is really important that you do this immediately, as we may have to notify other children of the need to isolate. We rely on your honesty with this information, so that we can protect our school community and help stop the spread of Covid 19.

We keep everyone who is affected by Covid 19 in our thoughts and prayers.
