Attendance

If your child is well, please ensure that they attend school and arrive on time. Many months of teaching time were lost last year and teachers are working extremely hard to recover some of the lost time. Children need to be in school to benefit from this.

The class with the highest attendance this week is **Year 1D** with 98.7%. Well done to all the children and families in Y1D.

Covid 19

As you are all aware, we had our first confirmed case of Covid 19 this week which resulted in the closure of one of our Year 6 classes. You will be pleased to learn that the child concerned is coping well. Thank you to all the families affected for your support and understanding. We all have a duty to keep each other safe. I hope that your children are engaging well with the remote learning which Mr Flint is providing. If you have any queries about the work or need any support, please contact us.

Can I also take this opportunity to remind you about the staggered start and finish times we operate. It is really important that you keep to your times and arrive no more than 5 minutes before your start time to avoid congestion and risk of infection.

Whilst on school premises, please ensure that you maintain a 2m distance from other children and their families. If you are less than 1m from an infected person for 1 minute, or 2m away from them for 15 minutes, you will be forced to self-isolate for 14 days. This means that you will not be able to leave your home. Please bear this in mind when dropping off and collecting your children.
