## Covid 19

We look forward to welcoming the staff and pupils from one of our Year 6 classes back on Monday. Should a class have to close or your child have to self-isolate, the class teacher will provide your child with daily work to complete, so that their learning is not seriously affected.

We know that Manchester is still an area of high alert in relation to Covid. Whilst on school premises, please ensure that you maintain a 2m distance from other children and their families. If you are less than 1m from an infected person for 1 minute, or 2m away from them for 15 minutes, you will be forced to self-isolate for 14 days.
