Another week of learning has passed here at St Clare's. Nursery have been reading about the superhero Super Tato. #### **Attendance**

### Covid 19

Although many Covid restrictions have been lifted in school, we are still following the Covid guidelines set by the government. If your child develops a high temperature, a new, continuous cough or their sense of smell or taste changes, they need to take a PCR test. Your child only has to be displaying one of the three symptoms. They should not be sent into school until they have a negative PCR test or they have completed their isolation period. Children will still be sent home from school if they are displaying any of these symptoms.

We will send you a 'Warn and Inform' letter should someone in your child's class test positive for Covid. If somebody in your family tests positive for Covid, we will encourage all family members to take a PCR test. Track and trace will notify any close contacts who may need to isolate. We want to continue to keep our school community as safe as possible. Thank you for your cooperation during these times.

### **Parents evening**

You have already been notified that the app is open for booking your parents evening slot between 3.30pm and 7.00pm. Parents evening is being held in school this year. Each family has a five minutes appointment. Should you need longer than this, you would need to arrange a separate meeting with your child's class teacher. The appointments will be in your child's classroom. Mrs O'Keefe will also be operating SEND drop in sessions throughout the evening.
