Dear Parents / Carers,

It was lovely to be able to invite you in to attend parents' evening this week. Thank you to everyone who attended. I hope you enjoyed looking your through your children's books and hearing about their progress.

This week, our Nursery children have been looking at 2d shapes in our school environment. Reception have been learning about our emergency services and that they dial 999 in an emergency. Ipads have been used in Year 1 to make instructional videos. Year 2 have been using adjectives and conjunctions to write a description of Traction Man. Cross-curricular work has been happening in Key Stage 2. Year 3 have been using their research of mountains in geography to write a nonchronological report and Year 4 have written non-chronological reports about the Anglo Saxons. Year 5 have been drawing figures that move and are going to incorporate them into the Ancient Greek vases they are making. Year 6 have been learning about rivers and mountains and have produced art linked to the topic.

Assembly

This week's assembly was about 'Hope in the Future' and was led by Miss Meadows. *Hope in the Future* is an invitation to each of us, from Pope Francis and Bishop John, to be Missionary Disciples of Jesus by sharing our Faith in word and action.

On 4th October 2017 (the feast of St Francis of Assisi), Bishop John launched the programme in our Diocese of Salford. On 3rd October 2021, we launched Stage 4 of our journey focussing on 'Proclaiming the Good News'.

Bishop John is asking our Homes, Schools and Parishes to work closely together as we grow in Faith together and share our Faith with those around us by what we say and do.

Covid 19

Although many Covid restrictions have been lifted in school, we are still following the Covid guidelines set by the government. We have had several positive Covid cases in our Key Stage 1 classes over the last two weeks, so we need to be extra vigilant. If your child develops a high temperature, a new, continuous cough or their sense of smell or taste changes, they need to take a PCR test. Your child only has to be displaying one of the three symptoms. They should not be sent into school until they have a negative PCR test or they have completed their isolation period. Children will still be sent home from school if they are displaying any of these symptoms.

We will send you a 'Warn and Inform' letter should someone in your child's class test positive for Covid. If somebody in your family tests positive for Covid, we encourage all family members to take a PCR test. Track and trace will notify any close contacts who may need to isolate. We want to continue to keep our school community as safe as possible. Thank you for your cooperation during these times.
