Attendance

Whole school attendance for this week is 97.5% and for the half-term is 97.3% Well done everyone!

The class with the highest attendance this week is **Year 3M** with an amazing 99.2%. We also have 5 other classes who have over 98% attendance – Y3S, Y4RW, Y5O and Y6F. Well done to all the children and families.

Covid 19

As you are aware, Manchester has now moved to the very high alert level – Tier 3. We must continue to be vigilant in order to protect each other. If your child shows any of the three main symptoms of Covid, they must not come to school. You should arrange for a Covid test and anyone in your household must self-isolate whilst waiting for the test result. If the test is positive, the whole family has to isolate for fourteen days from when the symptoms started, even if they feel well and are not showing any symptoms themselves. The child with the positive test has to self-isolate for ten days.

We pray that everyone is safe over the half-term holiday, but should anyone in your household test positive please notify us, as usual, on the school app. It will be monitored over the holidays for urgent matters. We especially need to know if your child develops symptoms and has a positive test result over the next few days as that could impact on their class.

Please ensure that you do not arrive too early to drop your child off in the morning. Arriving five minutes before your child's start time is sufficient. If a member of staff is stood on the KS2 playground, you may leave the premises as soon as you have left your child with the member of staff. Whilst waiting to collect your child at home time, please keep a safe 2m distance from other adults on the playground. We need to minimise contact between different families.
