Art success

In June, our children entered a competition run by North Manchester General Hospital. They were looking for schools to partake in an artwork competition based on the NHS which they wanted to display around the hospital. The themes were love the NHS, what makes you happy or your favourite thing about North Manchester. Out of 7 winners, children from our school won 4! Attendance

Attendance this week is looking much better with whole school attendance at 96% so thank you. Two classes have had 100% attendance this week which is brilliant. The classes are 6F again and RM. Well done to both classes!

Covid 19

We are still following the Covid guidelines set by the government and advice from Manchester LA. If your child develops a high temperature, a new, continuous cough or their sense of smell or taste changes, they need to take a PCR test. Your child only has to be displaying one of the three symptoms. They should not be sent into school until they have a negative PCR test or they have completed their isolation period. Children will still be sent home from school if they are displaying any of these symptoms.

We will send you a 'Warn and Inform' letter should someone in your child's class test positive for Covid.

Important new information from Manchester: As rates are increasing, Manchester have requested that we ensure that any household members who are close contacts of a positive case in KS2, who are exempt from isolation and are attending school should carry out daily lateral flow testing for 10 days after the onset of symptoms (or positive test if asymptomatic) in the case in their household, and only attend school if their lateral flow test is negative. They are also encouraged to follow national guidance for all contacts and access a PCR test. Visitors coming into school will be required to wear masks. This advice will be reviewed in two weeks.

Support

As a school we are here to support your child academically, spiritually and emotionally. If you are in need of any support, any support at all - this could be food or clothing – you must contact us at school. We may be able to help you and will not make judgements. If we cannot help you, we know of many agencies that can offer support including our own church. Please contact Mrs Sylvester for a discrete conversation if you require support.

Safety

Please ensure that when you are bringing your child to school in the morning or collecting them in the evening, that you access the school premises via the front playground. Do NOT walk down the drive. Cars enter and leave school throughout these times and we want to keep all our children safe. We do not want children to think that it is safe to walk down roads when there is a safer alternative.
