

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

#### **Teaching letter formation**

#### Handwriting phrases for helping your child to form letters

This works best if your child practises for a short time every day.

- 1. Show the picture side and air-write as you say the phrase.
- 2. Ask your child to practise in the air with you.
- 3. Using a sharp pencil and sat at a table, encourage your child to have a go.
- 4. Praise your child for their efforts.
- m Maisie, mountain, mountain
- $\mathfrak{a}$  round the apple, down the leaf
- S slither down the snake
- d round his bottom, up his tall neck and down to his feet
- t down the tower, across the tower
- i down the body, dot for the head
- n down Nobby, over his net
- p down the plait and over the pirate's face
- q round her face, down her hair and give her a curl




#### **Book Bag Books**

### Is My Child on Track?

Term	Where should my child be?
End of Autumn 1	Read single-letter Set 1 sounds (first 16)
End of	Read all Set 1 single letter sounds
Autumn 2	Blend sounds into words orally
End of	Blend sounds to read words
Spring 1	Read short Ditty stories
End of	Read Red Storybooks
Spring 2	Read Set 1 Special Friends
End of	Read Green Storybooks
Summer 1	Read 4 double consonants e.g. ss, ff, II, zz
End of	Read Green Storybooks
Summer 2	Read first 6 Set 2 sounds (ay ee igh ow oo oo)



#### What can I do?

- 1. Use pure sounds rather than letter names.
- 2. Teach the picture names.
- 3. Practise reading sounds speedily.
- 4. Fred talk games at home.
- 5. Use the handwriting phrases to practise writing.
- 6. Use Fred fingers to help with spelling.
