

Y3 Curriculum Newsletter - Summer 2026

Literacy

Class Target - To sustain reading and become fluent whole chapter readers. To write in complete sentences and proof-read our writing for spelling and grammar mistakes. To make every word count in our writing.

We will read 'Cookie' by Connie Huq and try to write in her style and poems celebrating diversity.

Maths

The children will continue to develop fluency, reasoning and problem solving with numbers to 1000 and the four operations; +, - X and ÷. These number methods are transferring into measures and shape. We are working on fractions, using number lines and bar charts and also equivalent fractions.

Practise times tables on paper or on TTRockstars. Can you go up a rockstar group?

Science

Learning will link to the theme of Plants and then Light and Seeing. Why not grow plants from seeds at home and measure how much they grow a week and the amount of water they need?

Spellings

SoundsWrite spellings will be given out Wednesdays ready for a 'show us what you know' test on Mondays. Children need to say the sounds as they practise and identify syllables.

RE

Our topics are **Energy** and the significance of Pentecost, **Choices** and the Sacrament of Reconciliation and **Special Places** using materials from CAFOD.

ICT

We will use the program **Scratch** to complete programming skills in **music** and **mazes**.

Art

Sculpture and collage with natural materials and plants.

DT

Music

The children will be focusing on appraising music, looking at different significant composers.

History and Geography

In **Geography** they will learn about 'Coasts', exploring atlases and online maps to find features of coasts, how they are formed, erosion and the importance of local coasts and coasts around the world.

PE

We will continue our tennis skills as well as catching and fielding games, including Scatterball and athletics. Practise batting and catching in the park. Swimming is still on Wednesday for Y3.

French- In French we are consolidating the basics of number, colours, days of the week and months, as well as describing our family. Our new learning will be describing our physical appearance and character descriptions.
