

Early Years Foundation Stage Newsletter Summer Term



This term

Welcome back to school and nursery for our last term of the school year.

This term, we're diving into the wonderful world "By the Sea"! The children will explore seaside life through stories, sensory play, and creative activities. From building sandcastles and learning about sea creatures to singing ocean-themed songs and discovering how to stay safe in the sun, this topic is full of fun and discovery.

We'll be using shells, water, and sand to spark curiosity and imagination, while also building early skills in communication, counting, and expressive arts. Don't forget your sunhat- is going to be lots of fun!

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

As our school year becomes close to the end we will be focusing our attention on the next steps for the children.

We will be continuing our work on emotions- what they are and how we can control our own emotions as individuals as well as taking our peers into consideration.

Children in reception class moving into year 1 in September will be taking part in their transition days to experience a day in their new classroom environment. More details will be shared closer to the time.

Physical Development

Physical Development is a vital part of our learning. During the children's time in school, they are given lots of opportunity to practice these key skills.

With warmer weather, we'll be making the most of outdoor play! From obstacle courses and ball games to lots of movement sessions, we're focusing on building coordination, balance, and confidence.

We'll also continue to develop fine motor skills through activities like cutting, threading, and markmaking.

Communication and Language

Communication and Language is entwined through every aspect of school and nursery life and is vital in ensuring good development in all areas.

We will be continuing to develop our oracy skills in class, making sure we take advantage of every space minute to share and talk to each other.

R.E

This term in R.E our topics will be:

- Good News- Passing on the Good News of Jesus
- Friends- Friends of Jesus
- Our World- God's wonderful world

Oracy is all about being a strong and effective communicator.

The children in nursery and reception class will be encouraged to and will be given lots of opportunity to develop their oracy skills. To do this they will be given lots of opportunity to talk, share stories, sing rhymes, develop their phonics skills and much more.

As part of the daily routine, we will be asking the children to join in daily prayers, including making the sign of the cross naming, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The children in Reception will also be taking part in whole school and key stage Celebration of the Word, as well as the Celebration assembly on a Friday.

Literacy

In Reception this term we will be continuing to work our way through the Sounds-Write units. The children are working very hard to build CVC words and some have started to use these to write sentences! We will now be moving onto VCC and CVCC words to extend the children's knowledge.

The children in Nursery are starting their phonics journey with Sounds-Write. During these sessions the children will be exploring CVC words- they will be focusing on a word of the week, listening for sounds in the words and what the sounds look like when we write them.

Stories are a big part of our literacy. We will be retelling, ordering and learning lots of new vocabulary along the way! Our Author of the term is Jill Murphy. We will be looking at her books to explore these different activities.

Maths

In Reception in maths this term we will be looking at:

- Numbers to 20
- First then and now
- Finding paterns- including doubles, sharing and grouping
- On the move

In Nursery maths we will be focusing on:

- Sequencing
- Position
- Comparing Groups
- 2D shapes
- 3D shapes
- Before and after

As well as consolidating our existing knowledge

Expressive Arts and Design

Creativity will be bursting this term! Well be painting, sculpting, dancing, singing, and performing. Children will be encouraged to develop their own ideas and express themselves in different ways.

Their creativity can be continued in the small world play in which the children can use their imagination to create their own stories with their friends.

Understanding the World

We will be exploring nature and mini beasts, taking part in bug hunts and planting sunflower seeds. The children have the opportunity to care for their flowers in school and learn all about how to care for living things.

We will also be exploring the world around uswhere we live in a seaside town and how this is different for other towns/ countiries in the UK and around the world.

2 Year Provision

The children accessing the two-year provision in nursery will be encouraged to take part in all aspects of the daily routine. Their learning will be play based and the children will be given lots of opportunity to progress in each area of development, with a focus on the prime areas of development and learning. These give an essential base for the children to develop core, lifelong skills for learning.

As part of the children accessing nursery it is a statutory requirement that we, as a nursery, complete a 2-year progress check. This will be completed in partnership with parents/ carers. The EYFS progress check at age two focuses on the three prime areas of learning:

- Communication and Language
- personal, social and emotional development
- physical development

Reminders

Warm Weather: As the weather is getting warmer, please apply suncream to your child on a morning before they come to school/ nursery. If your child stays all day, they can bring a bottle of suncream to school to reapply at lunch time.

Please make sure your child has a named hat and water bottle in school.

Names- Please make sure **all** items of clothing, water bottles and shoes are labelled with your child's name.

Your child must wear black shoes, grey trousers or skirt/pinafore, white polo shirt or shirt and a maroon jumper. For PE we require black shorts or joggers, white t-shirt (no slogans) and black or white trainers or plimsoles.

Water Bottles- Please make sure children only have WATER in their bottles.
