Y3 Curriculum Newsletter - Summer 2025

Literacy

Class Target - To sustain reading and become fluent whole chapter readers. To write in complete sentences and proof read our writing for spelling and grammar mistakes. To make every word count in our writing.

We will continue writing about Ancient Egyptians in the style of a newspaper article. We will read Leo and the Gorgon's Curse by Joe Todd-Stanton. After half term we will read short stories and poems celebrating diversity.

Maths

The children will continue to develop fluency, reasoning and problem solving with numbers to 1000 and the four operations; +, - X and \div . These number methods are transferring into measures and shape. We are working on fractions, including decimals, tenths and equivalent fractions.

Practise on paper or on TTRockstars. Can you go up a rockstar group?

Science

Learning will link to the theme of Plants and then Light and Seeing. Why not grow plants from seeds at home and measure how much they grow a week and the amount of water they need?

RE

Our topics are **Energy** and the significance of Pentecost, **Choices** and the Sacrament of Reconciliation and **Special Places** using materials from CAFOD.

History and Geography

We will continue to compare the ancient civilisations of Greece and Egypt. In Geography they will learn about rainforests.

ICT

We will use the program Scratch to complete programming skills in music and mazes.

PE

We will be teaching striking and fielding games, including Scatterball and athletics. Practise batting and catching in the park. Swimming is still on Wednesday for Y3.

Art

Sculpture and collage with natural materials and plants.

DT

We will complete Egyptian weaving and design a healthy dessert.

French- In French we are consolidating the basics of number, colours, days of the week and months as well as describing our family. Our new learning will be describing our physical appearance and character descriptions.

The children will be focusing on appraising music, looking at different significant composers.
