Literacy





This term, the children will be reading 'The Tempest' as their class novel, alongside 'No Ballet shoes in Syria' a modern story linked to Conflict.

Their writing will include a Narrative Dialogue scene, and a creature description linked to the Tempest.

Children will continue to read each night with daily GPS and spellings in class to consolidate GPS skills.

Maths

In math's this term, the children will focus on place value (up to and beyond 5 digits), addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, statistics, shape and measurement (length, perimeter and area). This will be revised in 5 a day as well as booster classes which will be starting this half term.

New learning will be focusing on Algebra, Percentages and Decimalsfocusing on reasoning and problem solving.

Science

Our first topic is **Evolution**. The children will investigate fossils and theory's linked to Evolution.

After half term, we will study the topic **Living Things**.

Home Learning

Daily reading is required still at home.

Times tables should also be practiced if not secure up to 12 x 12.

RE

This term's RE topics are Local Church and Eucharist followed by Lent.

History

We will be looking at the changing Power of the Monarchy in Britain.

ICT

Children will be learning about creating digital Movies and soundtracks.
