# The School Day

Our school has a Nursery and Reception class which are taught within an Early Years unit. We also have classes for KS1 and KS2 both of whom have their own playground, although children are sometimes brought together at lunchtimes through our Opal play and for other events.

Nursery children are eligible for a funded place in our school the term following their third birthday. However, we invite children in from when they turn 3. All children are offered 15 hours per week and we are flexible to suit the needs of our families as to how this 15 hours is offered. We also offer 30 hours for families who are eligible. To find out if you are eligible please visit **www.childcarechoices.co.uk**. Our website also sets out the criteria for eligibility.

Children who are in school for 30 hours can have a school meal at a cost of  $\pm 2.20$  or they can bring a packed lunch. Those children who are only entitled to 15 hours can be booked in for extra sessions by contacting the school office. Extra sessions are charged at  $\pm 12.50$ . For those children who are entitled to 30 hours provision (6 hours per day), there are no additional costs. Children are on site from 8.50 - 3.15 pm but the additional time is not charged for.

## Wraparound Care

### **Breakfast Club**

We run a Breakfast Club which is open from **7:45 am until the start of school** at a cost of **£2.00 per child per day**, which includes breakfast, drinks and a range of activities. Our breakfast club is sponsored by **Magic Breakfast**, which enables us to keep the cost down for parents.

We ask that children arrive before 8:30 am if they require breakfast. Parents book for the breakfast club using the online payment system '**Scopay**'. However, if attendance is required without notice, it can also be used as a drop off service.

### Afterschool Child-Care

We also offer an After School Club from **the end of the school day until 5.45 pm.** The daily cost is £5.00 from 3.15 pm until 4.30 pm or £8.00 from 3.15 pm until 5.45 pm. Children will also receive a snack, a drink and various activities will be offered.

Parents must come to the main entrance/ reception to collect their child. Please ring the bell and a member of staff will come to you. Parents will complete a form when their child starts informing the school who will be picking their child up at the end of a school day or from the after school club.

Please ensure if anyone different is collecting your child from our After School Club, you provide school with a password. Parents book for After School Club using the online payment system '**Scopay**'.

If attendance is required without notice, parents can ring the school before 2pm for the child to attend that day. Other Extra Curricular Clubs after school are also offered during the year and parents will be notified of these clubs on a termly basis. There is a small cost for these clubs. The clubs usually finish at approx. 4.15pm-4.30pm. If required, children can then access our After School Club until 5.45pm at a cost of £5.

Payment for the above must be via Scopay as we are a cashless school. We do accept childcare vouchers or payment via the 20% tax free childcare scheme. Please inform the school office if you wish to pay by these methods.

# Safeguarding

#### Safeguarding is the responsibility of everyone!

At St Cuthbert's Catholic Primary School, we place utmost importance on our duty to keep children safe from all forms of harm. All staff recognize the essential part they play in identifying dangers, keeping children safe and protecting them from harm. All staff are trained regularly to ensure they are up to date with current regulations and guidelines.

As a school:

- ★ We work hard to establish and maintain a school environment where children feel safe and secure and where they know that they will be listened to in an open and positive atmosphere.
- ★ We ensure that children know that they can approach any member of staff if they are worried or in difficulty.
- ★ We actively seek the views of children listening to them and involving them in decisions about our school and their education.
- ★ We work in partnership with our families to ensure that we are open and transparent regarding any concerns we may have.
- ★ We will make any referrals necessary to ensure the well-being of all children is safeguarded.

#### If any member of our school community has a concern regarding the safety of our children, we would ask them to approach a member of our safeguarding team.

#### At St.Cuthbert's Catholic Primary School we believe that inclusive education means providing all pupils with appropriate education and support alongside their peers.

Every child is seen as unique at our school and nurtured to achieve their full potential.

It is our policy to provide learning experiences that are differentiated to take account of the needs and attainments of all our children. Children with special needs will be identified at the earliest possible opportunity and supported by the staff of the school in accordance with government legislation.

The Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator (SENCO), is able to support and coordinate advice for other professionals including the Local Authority Special Needs Team and Educational Psychologist.

Parents will regularly be invited to share their knowledge, views and experience of their child's special needs in order to ensure the most appropriate provision is provided.

Children will also be given the opportunity to reflect on their needs and have their views taken into account.

Our Special Educational Needs Policy reflects the changes recommended by the Special Educational Needs Code of Practice 2014.

## Admissions

Choosing a new school for your child is one of the most important decisions you have to make as a parent and we hope that we will be your first choice. We welcome all children, regardless of background, religion, ethnicity, Special educational needs or disability and strive to make transition to our school as smooth and supportive as possible. We achieve this by working closely with each child and their parents and a child's previous school or other multi-agency professionals.

For pupils with special educational needs or disabilities, we would ask parents to discuss the identified needs with the school prior to starting so that appropriate intervention and support can be planned and implemented. Advice from the LA or other agencies may be requested to ensure any the school can meet any needs appropriately.

Visit the Durham County Council website for information regarding the school admission process and primary school admissions. The application can be downloaded from this website and returned via email or post. Applications should not be made to the school directly. Children and young people with an Education, Health and Care Plan (or Statement of Special Education Needs) follow a different admission and transfer process for a new school.

Please continue to complete Durham County Council's parental preference form, as part of the admission process to a new school.

You continue to have a right to request a particular school and this will be considered alongside the information that we have about your child's special educational needs.

The information would have been provided as part of the Education, Health and Care assessment or following the review meeting.

You are more than welcome to visit us before you make your decision. The admission limit for the number of pupils in each year group at our school is 30.

### School Uniform

Please do not allow your child to bring a rucksack into school as they become a trip hazard as we do not have the storage capacity. Please only bring a separate bag if your child is swimming.

Children leave St. Cuthbert's with a strong sense of belonging to a tightly knit and happy community where they have the confidence and skills to make good decisions, self-evaluate, make connections and become lifelong learners. At St Cuthbert's Catholic Primary school we provide a broad and balanced curriculum for children of all ages, a curriculum that is engaging, exciting and empowering equipping them both for today and tomorrow. Children in the Nursery and Reception years follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Framework (EYFSF) and children from Year 1 to Year 6 follow the National Curriculum.

Our curriculum is designed to promote an enjoyment of learning, is 'knowledge rich', recognises children's prior learning, provides first hand learning experiences, allows the children to develop interpersonal skills, builds resilience and empowers them to become creative, critical thinkers. We know how important it is for our children to have a range of experiences that help them to develop their understanding of the world around them, to be responsible members of society and to recognise the wide range of opportunities and interests that are available to them.

All members benefit from the strong ethos and quality governance. Research School status and strong links with the National College for Teaching and Leadership means that professional development of staff is central to the work of the Trust.


