Dar nursery

Eligibility: Children become eligible for a funded place in our nursery the term after their 3rd birthday. However, children may start attending from their 3rd birthday.

Hours Offered:

15 Hours Per Week: All children receive 15 hours per week.
We offer flexible scheduling to accommodate family needs.
30 Hours Per Week: Available for eligible families.

Meals and Additional Sessions:

30 Hours: Children attending for 30 hours can have a school meal for £2.20 or bring a packed lunch. There are no additional costs for the 30 hour provision.

15 Hours: Extra sessions can be booked at £13.50 per session.

Wraparound care

Breakfast Club:

Children can arrive from 7:45 am. The cost of the club is £3 per child

Afterschool Child Care:

After school club is available until 5:15pm

£5 from 3:15pm-4:15pm £6.50 from 3:15pm-4:45pm £8 from 3:15pm-5:15pm

After school club must be booked and paid for in advance

Dur school uniform




