## News from 0-3s Babies, Blue and Green Classes

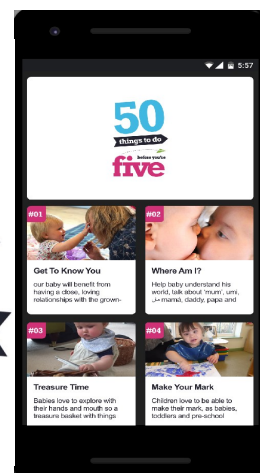
