Inclusion statement

The school community will ensure that ALL children irrespective of race, ethnicity, nationality, gender (including those who identify as transgender), sexual orientation, ability, special educational need, disability, faith or religion, age, culture, socio-economic or home background will have equal access to the breadth of this policy.

The achievements, attitudes and well-being of all our children matter and the school will endeavour to promote their individuality. Children with learning disabilities and gifted and talented children will be allowed to express themselves according to their ability. Work will be differentiated to meet their needs and achievements will be celebrated.

This policy will be implemented through on going consultation with all members of the school community and developments in law or statutory guidance.

Background

In 2021, a new law was passed to make school uniforms affordable. This was followed up in Autumn 2021 with new, statutory guidance published by the Department for Education.

This statutory guidance means schools should:

- Prioritise cost and value for money for parents first, when setting uniform policy.
- Engage with parents and pupils when developing their uniform policy.
- Keep the number of branded items to a minimum.
- Ensure second-hand uniform is easily available.
- Make the uniform policy clear and easy to access for parents.
- Ensure uniform suppliers are good value for money, and avoid relying on single-suppliers.

The Federation of St Elphege's Schools has always had these core values at the heart its Uniform Policy and therefore, demonstrating compliancy with this new guidance does not require any significant policy reforms.

Aims

This policy sets out The Federation of St Elphege's Schools' expectations for uniform, how the school will ensure affordability for parents and the uniform support available for parents. This policy is implemented through ongoing consultation with parents, children and staff of the school.

The schools recognise that uniforms are designed to break down barriers, to help every child feel they belong. A uniform can bring the school community together, and develop a sense of school identity - but this can be achieved without unnecessary financial pressure on families.

The majority of branded items of uniform are available to purchase from our supplier: www.myclothing.com

To ensure that our parents receive competitive pricing, value for money and high quality uniform items, suppliers are reviewed every 3 years by the Director of Finance and Operations.

School ties for children in the Junior school are supplied by Hewitt's and available to purchase from the school office for £2.50.

Whilst branded items of clothing are available for purchase through the above link, many of our families opt to purchase unbranded uniform. Unbranded uniform is available from a wide range of retailers and is perfectly acceptable at St Elphege's, providing it is in keeping with the school colour and design.

We recognise that children grow quickly and one of the most expensive items of clothing on the uniform list are shoes. For some parents, this may present an additional financial pressure. To help alleviate this pressure, if parents wish, children may wear <u>BLACK</u> trainers to school. This way, families only need buy one pair of shoes at any one time, for use in school, outside of school and also for sporting events.

It is very important that all items of clothing brought into school are clearly labelled with your child's full name.

Uniform Expectations

We expect our community to adhere to the uniform expectations outlined in this policy and, other than in exceptional circumstances, wear the correct uniform to school each day. Families who may experience difficulties ensuring that their child comes to school in the correct uniform on any given day should speak with the school office in the first instance who will be able to provide or signpost to support. If families experience more substantial challenges, the school is always willing to support where it can. Please speak with the school office, the pastoral support service or a members of the leadership team in confidence.

From time to time, the school may relax the uniform policy for special occasions, mufti days, periods of hot weather. On these occasions, we ask that parents are mindful of the schools' requests in terms of what will be appropriate for pupils to wear.

Other Accessories or Items of Clothing			
Earrings	 The school discourages pupils wearing earrings to school as they are unsafe for PE and games. If worn only studs, or sleepers should be used. Pupils are expected to remove their own earrings (if worn) when doing PE. 		
Jewellery	 Pupils should not wear jewellery to school, unless required by religious doctrine. 		
Hair Care / Coverings	 Long hair should be tied up for safety reasons. The school encourages the wearing of plaits to attempt to keep children's hair free of lice. Extreme haircuts are discouraged. Hair should not be coloured. Head / hair coverings may be worn for religious reasons. Hats should be worn during particularly hot weather. 		
Trainers	 If pupils wear trainers for school each day, they must be black only. Plimsolls are used for indoor PE and games. If trainers are used for PE, sports, or games the school suggests they are not expensive in case of loss. 		

Borrowing Uniform and Clothing

At times a pupil may be lent an item of clothing - this could be because they have been sick or had an accident, or did not have the appropriate clothing in school. We ask that parents/carers return the washed clothing to the school office.

Lost Property and Second Hand Uniform

Occasionally, second hand uniform sales are organised. Information is shared through the school newsletter. Second hand uniform for sale is either unclaimed lost property or donated to the school as a child grows. We know that parents also share uniform amongst themselves when their child has outgrown it. We fully support and encourage this and will help to facilitate it where possible.

Where families may be experiencing difficulties, the school may be able to provide items of uniform to children free-of-charge.

Any items of uniform that are unclaimed and not re-used are donated to a school in Nigeria at the end of each academic year.
